**NATIONAL COUNCIL ON WOMEN AND DEVELOPMENT (INTERIM MANAGEMENT
COMMITTEE) ACT, 1987(1)**

**AN ACT to provide for management of the affairs of the National Council on women by a law
Committee and for related matters.**

1. Dissolution of National Council on Women and Development

The Membership of the Council of the National Council on Women and Development existing under the National Council on Women and Development Decree, 1975 (N.R.C.D. 322) is hereby dissolved.

2. Interim management committee

(1) Until provision is otherwise made by law, the functions of the National Council on Women and Development under the National Council on Women and Development Decree, 1975 (N.R.C.D. 322) shall be exercised by an interim management committee established under subsection (2) of this section.

(2) The interim management committee shall consist of the chairman and nine other persons all of whom shall be appointed by the President.

3. Functions of chairman and executive secretary

Unless the President otherwise directs, the functions assigned to the chairman and executive secretary of the National Council on Women and Development under the National Council on Women and Development Decree, 1975 (N.R.C.D. 322) shall be performed respectively by the chairman of the interim management committee and a member of the committee designated by the President as the executive secretary.
